Pollinator Facts

Do you know what a pollinator is?

A pollinator is a creature that spreads pollen from one flower to another!

What kinds of pollinators are there?

There are many pollinators spreading pollen to your flowers every day! Can you spot all of these?



Butterfly – A pollinator with beautiful wings.

Bee – A pollinator covered in stripes.





Bat – A pollinator that comes out at night.

Ladybug – A pollinator covered in spots.





Hummingbird – A pollinator that sings while it works!

Do you know why they are so important?

Without pollinators, we wouldn't have food to eat! Pollinators pick up pollen when they visit a flower. When they fly to a new plant, they drop the pollen on the next flower. This process is what makes it possible for plants to make the food you eat!



Did you know we need to protect them?

Pollinators are in danger of disappearing!
Their habitat, the place where they live, is being destroyed to make room for cities and other areas where it is hard for them to make a home. They are running out of places to live and things to pollinate. Pesticides, chemicals that are dangerous to pollinators, have also become a big problem. When pollinators touch it, they die. Thankfully, there are simple ways to help your pollinators thrive!



How can you help?

One easy way you can help pollinators is by becoming a gardener! A gardener is a person who plants flowers and vegetables. Pollinators love flowers, and if you plant them, your garden will become a great food source for pollinators in your area! Don't use pesticides on your flowers to control bad bugs, or the pollinators who visit your house will get sick. Try to use the natural and cute alternative instead: ladybugs!




